DNR foresters are also available to personally help you find answers for almost any woodland-related question. A DNR forester can assist you in developing a forest management plan or refer you to a consulting forester for hire. Training and experience varies among consulting foresters, so it is wise to get references before hiring one.

Woodland Owners Association (WWOA) is another great resource for landowners. WWOA is a statewide organization, but has local chapters to facilitate local landowner interaction. 




